# 1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

# 1.1 INTRODUCTION

Union Education Society's Mahila Mahavidyalaya, Solapur, was established in the year 1989 under the vision of Late. Mr. Abdul Aziz Sultan Saheb Shaikh.

At the onset the institute provided the degree courses in streams of Arts. Within a brief span of time it has become a full-fledged college imparting education to the girls' in Art's faculty from BA – I to BA – III level. This is the only Mahila Mahavidyalaya in the vicinity of the Punyashlok Ahilyabai Holkar (P.A.H.) University, Solapur, having its center for teaching Urdu subject at graduation level. Moreover, the college has a provision for teaching all the subjects in English and Marathi medium even though, majority of the girls' come from Urdu background. Despite of it the results are meritorious. Students are securing various scholarship every year. This itself indicates that the college has high standard of teaching.

The institute runs various courses such as Add-on, Certificate courses to make the students skill oriented and to empower the girls' students. The college also organizes the various camps such as HIV, Hemoglobin check-up, Physical Fitness, Voter's awareness campaign and other activities to inculcates the sense of social outreach in the young minds.

The faculty members are well qualified with good sense of social responsibility which helps the students to progress in education and in all walks of life. The student's assessments are routinely done by taking Bridge course, Remedial coaching class, Tutorials, assignments, and Seminars. The committees in the college are CDC, IQAC, Grievances Redressal & Anti-ragging committee for the welfare of the students.

We provide the best infrastructure with all the facilities including well equipped library, smart classes, computer lab, ladies room with spacious and pleasant premises. The campus is covered with CCTV surveillance. During the pandemic situation the faculty members updated themselves for using various mobile apps and computers which could help in the online teaching learning process. Various online and offline teaching methods are used.

Our students were honored with Gold, Silver Medal, Cash prizes in sports and academic activities. Various workshops, seminars and webinars has been conducting to develop the personality of the students.

The college library is automated with SOUL 3.0 version. Facility to access e-books and journals is available through N-List.

The college runs number of skill oriented course to empower girl's students.

The NSS unit of the college have been very active and participated with great enthusiasm in various activities like cleanliness campaign, plastic free campaign, health awareness program etc.

The college has an active alumni association witch works for the progress and development of the college.

Healthy interactive atmosphere between students and staff members.

Well structures mentoring system.

Timely conduction of examination and result declaration.

# 1.3 CRITERIA WISE SUMMARY

### **Curricular Aspects**

Union Education Society's Mahila Mahavidyalaya, Solapur is affiliated with P. A. H. Solapur University, Solapur. Hence, it follows the prescribed curriculum of the University. The College ensures an effective curriculum delivery through a well-planned and documented process such as the preparation of the academic calendar, departmental timetable, annual teaching plan, syllabus completion report, etc. In order to deliver curriculum, teachers use various ICT tools as well. The institution adheres to the academic calendar strictly and

implements it rigorously for a continuous internal evaluation system. There are 9 teachers in the college, out of them 7 teachers have worked and working on activities related to curriculum development and assessment of the affiliating University. Number of Add on, Certificate programs offered during the last five years is 36 in which 621 students have been enrolled. To carry out the smooth functioning of the college the meeting of CDC is conducted twice a year. To ensure effective curriculum conveyance, other than address strategy, the faculties of the college moreover utilize experiential, participative, problem-solving, and ICT-based teaching-learning strategies. The college has a carefully thought-out plan in place for the efficient implementation of the mainstreaming of social and cultural problems in the recommended curriculum and methodology. The institute ensures that cross-cutting concerns are included in the curriculum. Gender, the environment and sustainability, human values, and professional ethics are integrated into the curricula of the departments. During the Covid-19 period online learning Management system like Zoom and Google Meet etc. were being used for the effective delivery of curriculum. To inculcate Research Aptitude among the students besides the effective curriculum every year, the Environmental and Literary Projects were prepared by the students on the prescribed syllabus. Seminars, Quiz competitions, Remedial and Bridge Courses for Slow and Advanced Learners, Unit-Tests, and preliminary Examinations are conducted for enhancing the student's performance. The college has Internal Assessment Examination Committee to assess the performance of the students. The IQAC collected Feedback from various stakeholders such as Students, Alumni, Parents, and Teachers regarding the curriculum. After the collection of Feedback, the IQAC analyzed the Feedback and prepared an Action-Taken report.

#### **Teaching-learning and Evaluation**

Teaching-learning and Evaluation is a major areas of any institute. The average Enrolment Percentage of the students is 96.5% during the last five years. The average percentage of seats filled against seats reserved for various categories as per applicable reservation policy during the last five years is 100%. Our teachers identify the advanced and slow learners at the very beginning of the academic year and apply altogether different strategies for both categories of these students. Student-Full Time Teacher Ratio is 26:5 during the last five years. The percentage of full-time teachers against sanctioned posts during the last five years is 100%. The percentage of Full-time teachers with NET/SET, Ph.D. during the last five years is 62%. The pass percentage of students during the last five years is 81.17% (excluding back-lock students). IQAC ensures the use of studentcentric methods in teaching-learning processes. Accordingly, the teachers use methods such as experiential learning, participative learning, problem-solving methodologies, project-based learning, etc. that enhance their learning experience. IQAC promotes the use of ICT-based teaching as it enhances the teaching-learning process. It encourages teachers to achieve 'Blended learning' which refers to a learning approach that is a mixture of traditional classroom practice and the use of e-learning resources. It enables our teachers to teach effectively with the use of ICT. Presently, the ratio of mentors to mentees for academic and stress-related issues is 25:1. In terms of continuous internal evaluation, our college has its own effective continuous internal evaluation system. It is transparent and robust in terms of frequency and variety. Also, the college has a mechanism to deal with examination-related grievances which are transparent, time-bound, and efficient. POs, PSOs, and COs of the institute have been stated and displayed on the institutional website. Also, IQAC ensures that attainment of POs and COs is measured at the end of every year, a student satisfaction survey at the institutional level was conducted by IQAC. A database of all currently enrolled students for the academic year 2021-22 has been collected for an online student satisfaction survey with regard to the teaching-learning process.

# Research, Innovations and Extension

Research Committee monitors research activities in the college. Two teachers are recognized research guides of P. A. H. Solapur University, Solapur. The college has organized total 24 seminars/conferences/workshops during the last five years. The number of Research papers published per teacher in the journals notified on the UGC care list during the last five years is 41. The number of books and chapters in edited volumes/books published and papers published in national /international conference proceedings per teacher during the last five years is 8. Total 100 extension activities are conducted in the neighborhood community by the college by NSS during the last five years. The college has received 15 awards/recognitions for extension activities during the last five years There are 11 functional MoUs with institutions for Academic Collaboration. There are 2 functional MoUs with institutions for Sports Collaboration. There are 5 functional MoUs with institutions for Environmental & Social Welfare Collaboration. PSOs- the College has adopted innovative methodologies of teaching-learning. Add-on Certificate and Bridge courses are amalgamating the theoretical and Practical aspects of the subjects such as certificate courses in Spoken English, fashion designing, beauty parlor, Translation, Basic Computer course, Jewelry Designing, Calligraphy, etc. All these programs are rigorously implemented and evaluated by the experts. One way to ensure that POs and COs are being met is to have each department analyze its results. After the overall results declared by the P. A.H. Solapur University Solapur awards are also given to the students who are meritorious. This encourages all the students to improve their performance as per the Outcomes-based framework. Two Gold Medals' of the university bagged by the student of Dept. of Hindi in the year 2020-21 and Department of Urdu in the Year 2021-2022. Two alumni qualified for TAIT, two alumni qualified for CTET, and two alumni qualified SET examination. Three students have been awarded Ph.D. degrees from Dept. of Urdu indicates our quality education. The best student award is given at the end of the year which takes into account all parameters of the outcome framework. This encourages the holistic development of students.

### **Infrastructure and Learning Resources**

The college offers a variety of infrastructure amenities, including classrooms, a seminar hall, a library, a reading room, a lady's room, a staff room, a principal's office, a gymkhana, a yoga room, a prayer room, indoor and outdoor facilities, an ICT lab, one projector room, two smart classes, and a NAAC room. Classrooms are well-ventilated with natural air and abundant sunlight. It has a seminar hall, an ICT lab, one projector room, two smart classes, Gymkhana to carry out curricular and extracurricular activities. The college has a well-furnished Faculty Room and separate cabins for Teachers. The College has enough room for Certificate courses and short-term, Add on courses, and Value-Based Courses. Available physical infrastructure is optimally utilized beyond regular teaching to carry out research projects, certificate courses, co-curricular activities, and staff meetings. CCTV cameras are monitoring the college campus. Power Backup(Inverter) is provided to the computer systems to use them optimally. Broadband Leased Line FTTH Internet is provided. LAN is connected to the ICT lab, Office, and Library. LAN and Internet connectivity are regularly tested. The College Infrastructure is maintained through an Annual Maintenance Contract (AMS) supplied to the relevant agencies, others are maintained by outside agencies on demand as needed, and yet others are maintained by institution faculty and specialized employees hired by management. To purchase computers, and other technology, our parent institution has designated dealers. Average percentage of expenditure, excluding salary for infrastructure augmentation during last five years is 2.004 lakhs. 'SOUL' (Version 3.0) integrated library

management software that has the modules like Book Management, accessioning, Membership, Circulation, Book Bank, and Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) had been installed. The library has institutional membership of INFLIBNET N-LIST center Gujarat for sharing e-resources such as ebooks, e-journals, e-databases (bibliographical and full text), etc Average annual expenditure for the purchase of books/e-books and subscription to journals/e-journals during the last five years is 1.64 lakhs. The student-Computer ratio is 12:1.. The available bandwidth of internet connection in the Institution is 100 MBPS. The college has designed a policy for the maintenance and utilization of physical, academic, and support facilities.

### **Student Support and Progression**

An average percentage of students who benefited by scholarships and freeships provided by the Government /non-government agencies during the last five years is 15.46. The college has initiated capability enhancement and development schemes such as Soft skills Development, Language and communication skills development through various short-term courses and activities, life skills (Yoga, physical fitness, health, and hygiene), and ICT/computing skills through various programs and initiatives. More than 1800 students have benefitted from capability enhancement and development schemes. The average percentage of students who benefited by guidance for competitive Examinations and Career counseling offered by the institution is 1.76. The institution has a transparent mechanism for timely redressal of student grievances including sexual harassment and ragging cases. The progression to higher studies of our students is %. The number of students qualifying in state/national/ international level examinations during the last five years is 6. The number of awards/medals won by students for outstanding performance in sports/cultural activities at the interuniversity/state/national/ international level during the last five years is 12.47%. The college has an active student council. The average number of sports and cultural events/competitions in which students of the Institution participated during the last five years is 500.8.

The Alumni Association of Union Education Society's Mahila Mahavidyala has been registered under the registration act 1860 registered number MH\_841/2019 to develop a strong bond between alumni, College, and the students. The Alumni Association connects the institution and former graduates. Alumni Association contributes significantly to the development of the institution. During the last five years, alumni have contributed Rs 73,600.

In the Covid-19 pandemic period due to the lockdown online alumni meet was conducted on 29th January 2022. Our alumni Miss. Simran Yasin Sayyed from Hindi Department secured first position in Hindi at degree level in P. A. H. Solapur University, Solapur, and was awarded Gold Medal and felicitated by the Alumni Association. Alumni donated Multifunctional Scanner & Water Cooler for the college. At the meet, the association discussed various topics such as organizing various Workshops, State/National Level Seminars in the future for the overall development of the students.

#### Governance, Leadership and Management

The governance of the institution has been reflective of effective leadership in tune with the vision and mission statement of the institution. It has a well-established system of effective practice of decentralization and participative management. The perspective plan is prepared and effectively deployed. For transparency and decentralization in the institute, the college has various committees. In regard to Administrative setup, rules and

regulations, recruitment of teaching and non-teaching staff, etc., the institute follows the service rules of the Government of Maharashtra, the affiliating university, and UGC. For promotional policies of teaching and nonteaching staff, the rules of the Government of Maharashtra, UGC, the affiliating university, and the governing body are followed. It has effective welfare measures for teaching and non-teaching staff. It implements egovernance in the area of administration, Student Admission Support, and Examination. As many as 4.2 percentage teachers completed professional development Programmes viz., Orientation/ Induction Programme, Refresher Course, Short Term Course during the last five years. Performance appraisal of teachers is done as per the rules and regulations of UGC and the affiliating university. The performance of non-teaching staff is assessed through a confidential report. Our institution is well known for its transparent and rigorous financial audit system. The college goes for an external audit by the Professional Charted Account Mr. Mushtaque Achkal from Solapur. The Annual Audit Statement is regularly submitted to the AO/Joint Director, Solapur region, and Govt. of Maharashtra. The college accounts are audited regularly with a 3-tier audit system. The College uses different ways of mobilization of funds and optimal utilization of resources. IQAC has institutionalized two practices as Introducing New Certificate Courses, Value Added Courses, and Organization of Workshops on Intellectual Property Rights & Professional Ethics. National seminars & Webinars were conducted on Gender Equality. It has taken Quality assurance initiatives of the institution that include regular meetings of the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC); feedback collected, analyzed, and used for improvements, collaborative quality initiatives with other institutions, and participation in AAA (Academic and Administrative Audit).

#### **Institutional Values and Best Practices**

#### Institutional Values and Best Practices

The college organizes 'Gender Equity Programs' in which different activities are organized for gender sensitization, Environment and Sustainability Promotion-related activities, and Professional Ethics and Human Values-related programs. It provides the facilities such as safety and security, counselling, and a Ladies' room. It has also made an annual gender sensitization action plan. With respect to environmental consciousness and sustainability, the institution uses LED bulbs for power saving. As the institution authorities are quite sensitive to health and hygiene; it takes many precautions in terms of its solid waste management. Water conservation facilities such as rainwater harvesting, bore-well recharge, and a water distribution system on the campus have been made available. The college has taken Green campus initiatives that include restricted entry of automobiles, pedestrian-friendly pathways, a ban on the use of plastic, and landscaping with trees and plants. The college has also done Green, Environment, and Energy audits of the campus. The Institution has created a disabled-friendly, barrier-free environment by providing all required facilities. The institution makes efforts in providing an inclusive environment i.e. tolerance and harmony towards cultural, regional, linguistic, communal, socioeconomic, and other diversities. Also, it makes sensitization of students and employees of the institution to the constitutional obligations like values, rights, duties, and responsibilities of citizens. It has a prescribed code of conduct for students, teachers, administrators, and other staff and conducts awareness programs about them. National and international commemorative days, events, and festivals are celebrated in the institute. 'and 'Organization of Dentaln Chechup Camp, HIV Checkup camps, and Health Checkup camps were organized. Organization of Gender Equity Programs for Women Empowerment and Empowered Women Faculties: Empowering Future Women are two best practices that have been successfully implemented by the Institution. One area distinctive to Institution's priority and thrust is Nation Building Through NSS.

# **Institutional preparedness for NEP**

1. Multidisciplinary/interdisciplinary:

U.E.S. Mahila Mahavidyalaya, Solapur has a holistic multidisciplinary curriculum with a vision to equip the students with an overall knowledge on allied fields apart from their core subject. Humanities is the integral part of the Art courses in the institute for every B.A. course subject like compulsory English, compulsory Urdu, compulsory Hindi, English optional, Urdu optional, Hindi optional, Persian optional, Sociology optional and Geography optional are taught in their first six semester. Credit basis course on Environmental education is a part of the curriculum. Projects on various Environmental issues are undertaken by students every fourth semester. For example: Air pollution, Marine pollution, Soil

pollution and Thermal pollution, Solar Energy, Global Warming, Deforestation, Human and Environment, Environment Education & Water Security. University has allotted 10 marks Home Assignment for the students and Home Assignment is essential by the college and sent to the University to include in the final Exam. As per the Present Curriculum Structure which is designed by the member of BOS and designed curriculum is followed in the college. B.A. students take admission in 1st year and complete the course at the end of the 3rd year. The institution is get to plan the flexible structure of entry and exist at the end of 1st, 2nd & 3rd year. One of our faculty member is the guide under PAHSUS and four students are doing Ph.D under her guidance. The institute has organized the One-Day State Level Seminar on the IPR to promote the innovations in Research for students and faculty.

### 2. Academic bank of credits (ABC):

As per the New Education Policy 2020 the Academic bank of Credit (ABC) is going to implement by our Parent University to provide facility and mobility of students. Our institute also adopting the Policy Guidelines for the appropriate credit transfer. The institute has been following the pattern of CBCS adopted by the University. The University has informed the institute about the necessary action and implementation of ABC. The Teaching and Non-Teaching staff of our institute instructed the stakeholder regarding the same. The University is likely to conduct the workshop or seminar for the implementation of ABC account opening. The institute appointed a faculty members as coordinator for the execution of Guidelines given by the University. The institution has signed an MOU with colleges C.B. Khedgi College, Akkalkot for faculty and student exchange programme.

# 3. Skill development:

The institutions skill development efforts resonate with that of National Skill Development Corporation evident through its enrichment of curriculum, electives, Add-on courses etc. The institute organizes various certificate courses such as Spoken English, Basics of Computer, Translation Studies, Calligraphy, Fashion Designing, Beauty Parlor, Yoga Meditation and Mehandi course etc. to enhance and to exhibit the inner qualities of students in various fields. The Soft Skill development program is an integral part of every students curriculum. Besides

English Learning and Teaching Skills, National Level and State Level Seminars, Guest Lectures are organized by the institute where student participation is witnessed in large numbers every year. Guest Lecture was conducted on the Soft Skill on the topic "Soft Skills: Intrapersonal Skills", on State Level Seminar is organized on the topic "Intellectual Property Rights: Laws and Practices" and Guest Lecture was conducted on Professional Ethics by the IQAC. Different Social Programs are organized under NSS to imbibe the holistic human values needed for the overall character development of an individual. Yoga Meditation course is organized for students to assimilate the values needed to live a peaceful life.

1.1.1 The Institution ensures effective curriculum planning and delivery through a well-planned and documented process including Academic calendar and conduct of continuous internal Assessment

### **Response:**

Union Education Society's Mahila Mahavidyalaya, Solapur is affiliated with P.A.H. Solapur University, Solapur. The college follows the curriculum prescribed by the university. To carry out a plan for effective curriculum delivery, the Principal of the college conducts the meeting and instructs all the Heads and Faculties. The college has an Academic Calendar Committee and every year it prepares the Academic Calendar. IQAC committee conducts four meetings per year and ensures effective educational programs conveyance by advising departmental heads to hold the meeting on the curricular planning and its execution. all departmental Heads plan the Academic Calendar of their departments. 'Time Table Committee' plans the college timetable in order to operate the teaching and learning process smoothly. A number of faculties were appointed as the member of BOS and they designed the syllabus according to the guidelines of the University. Heads of Departments allot a syllabus to the teachers of their departments and after that, all the faculties plan semester-wise/ yearly teaching plans according to the designated syllabi. Teaching plans prepared by the faculties are properly checked and signed by the head of the department and the principal of the college. Based on the Master timetable of the college, all departments moreover plan departmental timetables for the smooth working of departmental activities. At the end of the semester, staff individuals submit their syllabi completion reports. Staff individuals go to workshops on changed syllabi and execute recently presented syllabi as per the proposals given by the university authorities in the workshops. To carry out the smooth functioning of the college the meeting of CDC is conducted twice a year. To ensure effective curriculum conveyance, other than address strategy, the faculties of the college moreover utilize experiential, participative, problem-solving, and ICT-based teaching-learning strategies. Faculties refer the reference books, Journals prescribed by the University, and other information available through the Internet, Websites for effective implementation of the curriculum. During the Covid-19 period online learning Management system like Zoom and Google Meet etc. were being used for the effective delivery of curriculum. To inculcate Research Aptitude among the students besides the effective curriculum every year, the Environmental and Literary Projects were prepared by the students on the prescribed syllabus. Seminars, Quiz competitions, Remedial and Bridge Courses for Slow and Advanced Learners, Unit-Tests, and preliminary Examinations are conducted for enhancing the student's performance. The college has Internal Assessment Examination Committee to assess the performance of the students. Department of Geography organizes field visits/ study tours as a part of their curriculum. These field visits and study tours enrich students to gain the practical knowledge of their respective subjects. Apart from all these, the guest lectures, State and National Level Seminars/Webinars and One Day Workshops were also organized by the departments. Year-wise structured feedback regarding design and review of the syllabi is taken from the students, teachers, alumni and parents. It is analysed and action taken reports are uploaded on the website of the college.

# **Response:**

The IQAC of our college consistently ensures that its teaching and learning processes use methods that are focused on the needs of the students. As a result, the teachers employ techniques including participatory learning, experiential learning, and problem-solving procedures.

# **Experiential Learning:**

**Traditional Methods:** The teachers use Traditional Methods for Teaching the Learning process in the classrooms such as Black-Board and colorful chalk, Textbooks, and Reference books for a better understanding of the Syllabus.

**Project Based method:** Faculties of Geography and Environmental Studies are in charge of the fieldwork and field trips to the places such as Naldurug Fort, Akluj Waterpark, Hari Hareshwar Vidyagar's Beaches, and Murud Zanjira Fort etc.

Department of English, Urdu, and Hindi inculcate Research Aptitude among students, So these Departments inspire students to prepare Literary Projects on the Topics as per the syllabus prescribed by the University.

The College organises visits to various places such as Pollution Control Board, Solapur Municipal Corporation Solapur, Smruthivan Udhyan and Civil Hospital, Solapur for Environmental Projects.

Department of Geography arranged an Industrial visit to Shri Siddheshwar Sugar Factory and Central Towel Factory

Also, our students of the Hindi Department visit Punjab National Bank to take information about the utilization of the Hindi Language in the Bank.

# **Participative Learning**

In the teaching-learning process, our teachers also use participatory learning techniques.

- 1. They effectively implement the pedagogical technique of "questioning" into their regular class activities. By asking queries, the teacher not only makes his lessons interesting but also stimulates students' interest in learning.
- 2. The way the seminars are run is another illustration of participatory learning. The Department of English, Hindi and Urdu conducts Class Seminars. The teachers give the students pertinent topics. As a result, the students consult reference materials from print such as Magazines, Journals, Books and internet sources when writing their seminar papers. Finally, the students deliver the papers they wrote for the seminar.

4. For Participative Learning, the College also uses the ICT tools such as PPT presentations for the explanation of their topics. Screening of films based on novels and plays prescribed in the syllabus is organized to provide an audio-visual experience to students. Biographies of great heroes and the Geography department shows Documentaries on Environmental Awareness.

At the time of the Covi-19 period, the ICT Tools such as Google Meet App and Zoom App are used for conducting online classes.

The lecturers organize International and National quiz competitions as a part of participatory learning to improve students' general subject knowledge.

College also organizes Poster Presentation Competition on Environmental Awareness, English Literature and Social Networking. Some of our students have also participated and presented posters in poster presentation competitions at the University level and secured first position.

#### 2.5 Evaluation Process and Reforms

# 2.5.1 Mechanism of internal/ external assessment is transparent and the grievance redressal system is time- bound and efficient

#### **Response:**

Before classes begin, the principal addresses the newly enrolled first-year students and informs them of the college's policies, rules, and regulations regulating the teaching, learning, and examination processes. The college has an examination committee to ensure that the test process runs smoothly.

- 1. In order to improve teaching and learning experiences, evaluation is crucial.
- 2. In conformity with the standards and directives of P.A.H. Solapur University, Solapur, the college has started a continual and thorough internal assessment.
- 3. Examining committee plans and developing changes to the evaluation system in regular conversations with IQAC and department heads.
- 4. The college modifies the academic calendar to include short-term courses, internal assessments, and university exams.
- 5. To improve transparency and objectivity, the college's internal evaluation system has been decentralized.
- 6. In addition to the ways that the university specifies, such as assignments and tutorials, more pertinent techniques are tested such as Unit Tests, Preliminary Exams, Multiple choice questions, project work, etc. in the internal assessment.
- 7. A tentative schedule is created in accordance with the academic calendar, displayed on the notice board, and informed teachers make announcements in the classrooms.
- 8. The Examination Committee has a meeting with the Principal and all of the lecturers to ensure the integrity and correct conduct of the internal examination process.

- 9. The college's internal exams are overseen and administered by the examination committee.
- 10. Internal examination schedules are made known well in advance.
- 11. The exam committee receives the question papers from each teacher. The guidelines of the University are followed in the preparation of the question papers for the internal examination.
- 12. By giving the students assignments to complete, the departments of English, Hindi, and Urdu evaluate the student's learning levels.
- 13. Another compulsory paper introduced for these students from the academic year 2017-18 is 'Democracy, Elections, and Good Governance'. Question paper on this subject is set and assessed at the college level and obtained marks are forwarded to the university.
- 14. Every year, students enrolled in the mandatory course Environmental Studies—in particular, those in the S.Y. of all U.G. programs—are given a project to complete.
- 15. The institution's director of physical education organizes physical education exams for first-year students, during which an outside examiner evaluates our students' physical abilities.
- 16. Every department at the institution administers exams online using a Google Form at the time of Covid-19.

The methods for evaluating the achievement of POs, PSOs, and COs are linked in a systematic way. The University has a clear definition of POs. At the college level, the CBCS pattern systematically disseminates the values, knowledge, and information that lead to PSOs. College guarantees that the aforementioned goals are attained through productive conversations in CDC and IQAC. The goal of the institute is to improve the socially and economically disadvantaged classes through high standards of education.

The university administers the semester examination at the end of each term to assess the attainment of the POs, PSOs, and COs. Teachers evaluate students' PO and Co attainment at the same time as the assessment.

To evaluate the outcomes of the above programs, each and every activity is pre-planned. The college insists to nurture national values with compassion through its regular teaching, expert lectures, screening of films, neighborhood community surveys, study trips, field visit, industry visit, and visit to historical monuments.

COs – The College works at a different level to plan and execute its schedule. The 70-30 and 40-10 pattern evaluation for each course truly tests the achievement of Course Outcomes. Question Banks, MCQs

bank, Surprise tests, Home assignments, and Unit Tests are substantially helping to evaluate the learning outcomes.

PSOs- the College has adopted innovative methodologies of teaching-learning. #### **Response:**

4.3.1) The college has a reliable system in place for deploying and upgrading its IT infrastructure. College places a strong emphasis on its academic, administrative, and student staff members using ICT resources. The college's website is dynamic and initially updated with more room.

There are 23 computers and 08 laptops available in the college. The configuration of the computers is upgraded as per the advancement in the technology, starting with Intel Pentium Dual core, RAM – 2GB, HDD- 160GB, Monitor- 18.5" and continued with recent Intel Pentium i3 5th Gen, RAM-8 GB, HDD- 1 TB, Moniter-22.0", Dell Keyboard and Mouse.

The computer systems were installed in the Computer lab, office, and Library. Later on, Computers are connected to the LAN facility.

In the beginning, the Internet facility was provided with a wired connection to the Administrative Office and Departments. Then it is updated with Broad Band through LAN with increasing connections and VNC Technology Connection with 25Kbps to 210 Mbps. Fiber optic connections with 100 MBPS & Leased line connections are set up in departments. Initially, we started with using CAT-5 then CAT-6 cables and now we use OFC which gives fast speed. Anti-virus software named Net Protector & Total Security is installed on all computers and updated regularly.

The college has inverters, UPS, and diesel generators for continuous power backup.

Three of the classrooms of the college have been transformed into digital classrooms. There are LCD projectors in three classes. The CCTV system has coverage of the entire campus. The computers and laptops are connected with internet connections that are updated with the most recent versions of crucial software. The computers have Wi-Fi capabilities for connection. Computer technicians and service providers are hired to perform major repairs on the aforementioned IT equipment, and steps like routinely installing anti-virus software, formatting computers with a corrupt operating system, and replacing old computers' hardware with new computers are taken to maintain and use computers.

The institution has invested in a number of legal software programs for Academic and Administrative use, including MKCL, E-Vdyapith, E-Parvesh, E-Sevaarth Pranali, and MS Office 2016. The Parent Institute submits this report to the college for compliance The 24Q form is submitted to the Income Tax office after the date of every three months. The Auditor General of Maharashtra State Audits the financial affairs college after ten years.

The institution has certain strategies for the mobilization of funds and the optimal utilization of resources. The main source of funds is the Fee received from the students at the time of Admission. The institution

follows the rules and regulations of the Government of Maharashtra and PAH Solapur University, Solapur. Objectives

To aim at the overall personality development of the students, and be confidently prepared to face all the complex challenges of the changing scenario of the world.

Context

In pursuance of its aims & objectives, the Union Education Society has set up the Mahila Mahavidyalaya which came into existence in 1989. Within a brief span of time, it has become a full-fledged college imparting education to the girls' in Arts faculty BAI to BAIII. To fulfill the above objectives, the Management of Union Education Society Mahila Mahavidyalaya has been recruiting excellent qualitative staff. The maximum faculties are women who are strong communicators, use modern technologies for teaching-learning methods

The practice

During the last five years, a number of faculties have been honored with Ph.D., NET/SET, and M.Phil.

During the last five years, the college organized various National, State, and regional level seminars/Webinars and workshops. The college teachers published 41 research papers and articles in various (UGC-notified and reputed peer-reviewed) journals. The faculty members published 8 book chapters/books by reputed National/ International publishers and Conference Proceedings.

A number of faculties Participated in Faculty Development/Professional Development/administrative training programs

Problems Encountered and resources required

A very minimal amount of subsidy is provided for higher education so if the student seeks to get a chance at higher education still misses out because of a lack of economic resources. Due to inadequate Government funding, the demand for financial resources far exceeds the supply. A very small amount is available for innovative programs.

Nobody is capable of solving the problems at home for students in their studies as the members of families are illiterate regarding higher education, they totally rely on guidance at the college. Teachers faced difficulty in convincing their parents to the higher education.

The college must implement funding strategies to face all the above problems.

#### Notes:

Girls' education reduces inequality in society. Education empowers marginalized women and helps them build better futures for themselves and their families. To cater to the above needs, qualitative faculties are needed to increase the literacy rate in unprivileged societies.

At the College level financial problem is a major factor affecting girls' education followed by transportation, gender discrimination, and physical harassment at the college level were reported as factors affecting girl's higher education. To pay the admission fee, examination fee, transportation fee, and college dress of the students, our faculties assist the students in every possible way.

#### **Response:**

Respecting the Motto of Union Education Society's Mahila Mahavidyalaya, Solapur "Talub-ul-ilm Farizatun" means Acquiring Education is Obligatory, and the priority and thrust area for Institutional Distinctiveness was adopted as Empowerment of Women.

To impart formal and informal education to the children of the minority community in Solapur city Late Mr. Abdul Karim Bawalal Wakeel, a noted Advocate and Muslim leader took the initiative and set up an Educational institution under the name and style of "UNION EDUCATION SOCIETY'S, SOLAPUR." in the year 1944, the eminent personalities who associated with him for this venture extended their cooperation and invested their money, labour, energy, time and devoted their life for establishing the institution in this soil. As a result, this institution is seen today as well developed and well-established Muslim institution in the Solapur region which imparts education right from KG classes to Graduation.

The Educational activities of the institution started with the establishment of M.A. Pangal Anglo Urdu High School, Solapur in 1963. After the establishment of high schools, institutions felt the need of setting up Junior Colleges for girls and Boys for imparting education in Urdu medium. Consequently, M.A.Pangal Anglo Urdu Junior College and Begum Qamrunnisa Karigar Girl's Junior College came into existence in the years 1975 and 1983 respectively. Naturally, in due course of time, it became a dream of the Management to set up a Senior College for girls in Solapur. At last, the dream came true in the year 1989 and Senior College came into existence under the name and style of "U.E.S.Mahila Mahavidyalaya, Solapur". The main Architect of this Senior College was the Late Mr.Abdul Aziz Sultan Saheb Shaikh, Expresident of the Union Education Society, Solapur.

Within a brief span of time, it has become a full-fledged college imparting education to the girls in the Arts faculty from B.A-I to B.A-III level. This is the only Mahila Mahavidyalaya in the vicinity of the P. A. H. Solapur University, Solapur that has the facility for teaching Urdu subjects at the Graduation level. Moreover, the college has a provision for teaching all the subjects in English and Marathi medium even though the majority of girls come from Urdu backgrounds. Despite it, the results are meritorious. Students are securing various Scholarships every year for EBC, OBC, and Minority. This indicates that the college has a high standard of teaching.

We strongly believe in the dictum that "Knowledge is Power" Acquisition of knowledge leads to emancipation. This is more pertinent for us as ours is a girl's college. We visualize our students as active agents who work toward the eradication of gender inequality in society as they become empowered by the acquisition of higher education. We are always conscious of the quality of education provided to the students. For this purpose, apart from the traditional methods of teaching and learning, different types of innovative methods in teaching and learning have been adopted by the college like ICT-enabled presentations, use of Smart Board, screening of films and documentaries, invited lectures, publication of the Departmental Wall Magazines, interdisciplinary seminars and workshops, theme based exhibition by different departments of the college, educational tours and so on.

The College has been introducing the Value Added courses/New Certificate courses like Montessori, Fashion Designing, Beauty Parlour, Jewellery Designing, Zardosi, Spoken English, Basic Computer course, Translation, Urdu Calligraphy, Mehandi Designing, Yoga Meditation etc. for making the students skill oriented.

The Soft Skill development program is an integral part of every student's curriculum. Besides English Learning and Teaching Skills, National & State Level Seminars, Guest Lectures are organized by the institute where student participation is witnessed in large numbers every year. Every Year English Department and IQAC organized Guest lectures & workshops on "Professional Ethics and Codes of Conduct", and "Intellectual Property Rights". Different Social Programs are organized under NSS to imbibe the holistic human values needed for the overall character development of an individual. The yoga Meditation course is organized for students to assimilate the values needed to live a peaceful life.

The college organizes various programs like National Integration, Aids awareness, minority day, constitution day, and voter awareness programs to inculcate human value among the students.

During the last Five Years, the college has been organizing a number of programs for the development of the personality of the students.
